[Job quality in the UK survey](#)

The Office for National Statistics has released some new research on job quality across the UK. Findings include:

- 82% of employees worked satisfactory hours, with women more likely to be working satisfactory hours than men
- More employees reported working unpaid overtimes than paid overtime. Those working unpaid overtime were most common in highly-paid occupations such as managers, directors and senior officials. The industries regarding unpaid overtime tended to be in education, professional, scientific and technical activities, financial activities and information and communication
- Employees aged 16 to 20 were more likely to have a zero-hour contracts – with 1 in 7 in the accommodation and food services industry on a zero-hour contract
- Women were more likely to be in low-paid employment than man
- Over a third of employees aged 16 to 20 were in low-paid employment
- The proportion of employees who reported good career progression initially increases with age, reaching 64% in the 25 to 34 years age group, and then decreases, falling to 33% for those aged over 65 years
- Two-thirds of employees working in the financial and insurance activities industry reported good career progression opportunities.

Careers boost for young people

- A new careers programme will become available to primary school children that will encourage them to think about future jobs early and challenge stereotypes.
- From Jan 1st young people in years 8 – 13 will also have at least six opportunities to meet a range of providers of technical education. This will enable them to understand the full range of opportunities available to them such as apprenticeships, T Levels and Higher Technical Qualifications.

What do graduates do?

Prospects has published its latest edition of what do graduates do? which shows insights and analysis from the UK's largest HE survey. Highlights include:

- The majority of graduates (57.3%) were in full-time work 15 months after graduating, while 11.4% were in part-time employment
- Of those graduates in work, 74% were in professional-level employment – a higher proportion than those who left university the year before
- Occupations that saw the greatest increases in employment were 'other nursing professionals', marketing professionals, graphic designers, lab technicians and teaching professionals
- The facts below show some graduate outcomes in the South East and London

South East

- 2019/20 graduates working here: 12.2%.
- Share of self-employed graduates: 11.7%.
- Graduates working in SMEs: 27.3%.
- The most popular location of employment for sports and exercise science graduates (15.4%), followed by London.

London

- 2019/20 graduates working here: 23.1%.
- Share of self-employed graduates: 28.4%.
- Graduates working in SMEs: 25.4%.
- 48% of graduates working in London were not originally from the area.

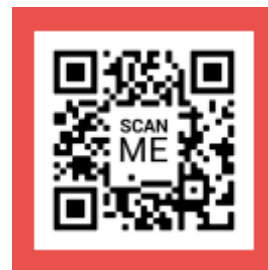
